Extra Help/LIS PROGRAM BENEFITS



LIS recipients are entitled to

Branded prescription drugs at an affordable cost—no more than **\$11.20/brand** prescription
(\$4.50 for generic), which is
a Medicare Part D benefit¹



Beneficiaries may receive full or partial subsidies^{2*}



Additional benefits

- No premiums
- No deductibles (unless receiving the partial subsidy)

Eligible patients get Extra Help/LIS BENEFITS 2 WAYS



These patients are automatically enrolled into an Extra Help/LIS plan²:

- Patients who have Medicare Part A and/or Medicare Part B
- Patients already entitled to Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Patients eligible for full Medicaid coverage
- Patients covered under one of the Medicare Savings Programs[†] as a
 - Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB)
 - Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB)
 - Qualified Individual (QI)



Through Social Security, these patients can apply for Extra Help/LIS benefits^{3‡}:

- A patient who has Medicare Part A and/or Medicare Part B
- A patient with combined savings, investments, and real estate (assets)



Worth not more than \$34,360, and if the patient is married and living with spouse§



Worth not more than \$17,220, and if the patient is **not married** and living with spouse[§]
